
This order covers security screening at the Macomb County Circuit Court Juvenile Division, 380 N. Rose, Mt. Clemens, Michigan and the Clemens Center, Market Street, Mt. Clemens, Michigan. It is the consensus of the Court, Macomb County, and the Macomb County Sheriff that it is in the best interests of justice and of citizens, employees, and elected officials to establish a no-weapons zones in the Macomb County Circuit Court Juvenile Division building and the Clemens Center, which can only be implemented through a search of persons and objects entering the buildings. Therefore:

Weapons (other than those carried by authorized law enforcement personnel and authorized Macomb County personnel), dangerous objects and explosives are prohibited in the Macomb County Circuit Court Juvenile Division building located at 380 N. Rose, Mt. Clemens, Michigan and the Clemens Center, located on Market Street, in Mt. Clemens, Michigan. "Weapons, dangerous objects and explosives" include but are not limited to, firearms, edged weapons and explosives as those objects are defined by common usage.

Security personnel under the control of the Circuit Court may search the person and belongings of any and every person who wishes to enter these buildings. Any person who refuses to cooperate may be removed from the buildings.

The initial screening of individuals entering the buildings will be by metal detecting equipment and security personnel screening personal property. The intrusiveness of any additional search and the length of detention, if any, shall be based upon reasonable suspicion that a further search of the person or object to be searched will reveal a weapon or other dangerous object that could be used to harm or injure.

This order shall be effective April 1, 2002, until modified by the Court.
